## WEEE- Collections-The Irish System

### **Waste Treatment Infrastructure**



Targets - Under the 2016 WEEE Directive, Member States are obliged to increase the level of WEEE collected: from 45% of electrical and electronic equipment (EEE) placed on the market in the three preceding years in 2016, to 65% of EEE placed on the market or 85% of WEEE generated in 2019

- WEEE can be dropped at Civic Amenity Sites-Free of charge
- PRI Scheme for WEEE & Batteries
- Two compliance Schemes
  - European Recycling Platform
  - WEEE Ireland
- One for One take back at Retailers
- Battery boxes at schools, supermarkets & Libraries
- Free collection days at Local Authority chosen venues and at workplaces









#### WEEE Ireland Members B2C Takeback Rate by Category 2018<sup>1</sup>

- Ireland surpassed the EU targets for household WEEE, and for recovery of categories of WEEE in 2016.
- On average >53,000tonnes of WEEl household and non-household) wer treatment.
